

Blenheim CBD Storm event 29 October 2021

CBD survey results

11 November 2021

What happened?

- Short, sharp rainfall event that affected central Blenheim starting at around 4.15pm on Friday 29 October
- >50mm of rain and hail in one hour
- Significant flooding event for the CBD and nearby residential areas
- No Metservice weather warning



Survey

- Survey aimed at identifying flood affected businesses in Blenheim CBD
- Issued on 3 November following discussions with Blenheim Business Association and Marlborough Chamber of Commerce
- Paper survey distributed on foot by MDC councillors/ staff and Harcourts and BBA volunteers on 3 and 4 November
- Online survey also available
- Survey closed on Wednesday 10 November






Key results

- 102 CBD business stated they were affected via the survey
- Flooding from roof/ceiling/ground and building damage were the biggest impacts
- 62% have insurance for building damage, 22% for financial losses. 4 businesses were uninsured.
- 64% had to close due to the flood, a third of these just on the Friday. 19% had to close for 3 days or more
- **38**% faced costs of \$1,000-\$10,000, **18**% \$10,000-\$50,000. **4** businesses stated costs of over \$50,000
- 9 businesses requested some form of support



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








Actions taken

- Mayor, councillors and staff from MDC, and volunteers from BBA visited all CBD businesses to deliver survey
- Businesses that requested support have all been contacted by Chamber of Commerce or Business Trust Marlborough to discuss needs and offer business support

Actions taken

- MDC water services team:
 - Responding to specific Council stormwater network issues raised from the surveys
 - Reviewing data from the survey to pinpoint areas for further investigation

Key messages

- The storm impacted a large number of CBD businesses. The businesses showed resilience in their response and were quickly back up and running in most cases
- A small number of businesses were significantly affected with large repair bills and/or extended closures
- Councillors/MDC staff, Harcourts staff and BBA walked the town to discuss the impact with businesses and deliver surveys
- Council services dept is assessing the stormwater network using feedback from the businesses
