## **7. Enforcement and Prosecution Committee**

(The Mayor) (Report prepared by T Quirk)

C135-E04

### **Purpose**

1. The purpose of this report is to finalise composition of the Enforcement and Prosecution Committee.

### **Background**

2. The Environment Committee at its meeting on the 10 June 2010 considered a presentation from the District Solicitor, Mr Radich on the establishment of such committee.
3. The Committee's recommendation such Committee be established was adopted by Council. It was intended it would have authority to consider matters of enforcement and prosecution
4. It was made clear at the time that decisions in relation to enforcement and prosecutions must be made properly and impartially based on information made available to the decision makers. The closest analogy given was to a Commissioner dealing with a resource consent application. In such a situation the decision of the Commissioner is essentially a decision of Council and should not be questioned
5. Initially the Council retained the ultimate decision making capacity on matters of enforcement and prosecution it being acknowledged that scope of Council's involvement on matters considered by the Committee would be limited to accepting any recommendations or, in exceptional circumstances, referring them back to the Committee for consideration.
6. Council resolved as follows:
  - a) That it establish in accordance with clause 30, schedule 7, Local Government Act 2002 establish a committee to be called the Enforcement and Prosecution Committee
  - b) That such Enforcement and Prosecution Committee be delegated under clause 32, schedule 7, Local Government Act 2002 full authority to consider and recommend on matters of enforcement and prosecution for all functions within Council.
  - c) That Council accepts the recommendations of that Committee and only in exceptional circumstances refers recommendations back to that Committee for further consideration.
  - d) That the membership of that Committee be as follows:
    - Two Councillors to be named as members each with an alternate to allow for absence conflict;
    - The Chief Executive or an alternate nominated by the Chief Executive
    - The District Solicitor or a barrister/solicitor or alternate nominated by him.
  - e) That the Enforcement and Prosecution Committee, once appointed, assess protocols for that Committee to follow and the criteria for that Committee to consider when determining whether or not enforcement action ought to be taken.
7. The Committee has determined on the protocols and criteria and has authorised some actions.

8. The protocols essentially follow the Crown Law Prosecutions protocols except for the inclusion of two elected members as members of the Committee. It was considered important that in setting the protocols and criteria there be two Councillor Representatives since it effectively was establishing policy for Council.
9. The Committee is now an operating Committee and three questions asked are:
  - Should there still be two elected representative or should there be none or the alternative one Councillor Representative.
  - Should the Committee have power to recommend only or should the delegation extend to full authority to consider and decide on matters of enforcement and prosecution for all functions within Council.
  - If there is an elected representative, should the appointment of a Councillor be such that if an issue arises on a particular Ward then any Councillor for that Ward is not involved but rather a Councillor from another Ward? The reason for this is to ensure there is an arm's length assessment made without the possibility that a Ward Councillor may be approached or may have a direct or indirect involvement with either the complainant or the party against whom a prosecution is being considered.
10. The Committee is essentially operating in a quasi judicial fashion and on that basis it is considered a power to consider and decide is more appropriate than to recommend.
11. It may be Council would prefer to retain some Councillor involvement and on that basis reduce Councillor representation from two to one rather than remove any Councillor representation.

#### **RECOMMENDED**

1. **That the previous decision of Council establishing a Committee be confirmed but with the following modifications:**
  - 1.1. **That the delegation be amended so that it provides for the Committee to consider and decide on matters of enforcement and prosecution for all functions within Council to the point**
  - 1.2. **That membership of the Committee is amended so that reference to two Councillors named as members be reduced to one with an alternate to allow for absence or conflict.**
2. **That the Councillor appointed to the Committee be Councillor Maher (Wairau / Awatere) with the alternate Councillors appointed being Councillor Oddie (Marlborough Sounds) and Councillor Leggett (Blenheim).**

## **8. Report from the Electoral Officer on the 2010 Triennial Election**

(Report prepared by Electoral Officer, D Heiford)

Reference (E090-10-17)

### **Purpose**

1. The purpose of this report is to inform the Council of the processes and outcomes of the 2010 Triennial Election.

### **Background**

2. The 2010 triennial elections have been conducted in accordance with the relevant legislation; the Local Government Act 2002, the Local Electoral Act 2001, The Local Electoral Amendment Acts 2002 and 2004, the Local Electoral Regulations 2001 and the Local Electoral Amendment Regulations 2003.
3. Council made a number of decisions in relation to this legislation prior to the elections being conducted. These decisions had a direct effect on how the elections would be conducted.
4. Council adopted Single Transferable Voting (STV) as the preferred method of conducting the 2010 elections. The decision means that STV has to be used for the 2013 Election.
5. Council undertook a Representation Review prior to the 2010 elections. The Local Government Commission reviewed the Council decision due to an appeal. The result was that the Pelorus / Northern Marlborough Sounds and Picton Wards were combined into the Marlborough Sounds Ward with the same number of representatives.
6. The following were the Wards and number of representatives per ward for the 2010 elections;  
Mayor – 1 position (elected at large)  
Blenheim Ward – 7 positions  
Wairau / Awatere Ward – 3 positions  
Marlborough Sounds Ward – 3 positions  
All elections were contested.
7. Council continued to allow progressive processing of the voting documents for the three week voting period, and for the candidates to be listed in random order on the voting documents. Processing of the voting documents was contracted to Electionz.com

### **Election Results**

8. Election of members to the Marlborough District Council was conducted between 17 September 2010 and 09 October 2010 with the final result declared on 14 October 2010.
9. The 56.48% turnout was higher than 2007 (50.65%) but still lower than 2004 (62.01%).

### **Electoral Roll**

10. The Electoral Roll is compiled with the assistance of the Electoral Enrolment Centre. A national campaign was undertaken to encourage people to register on the parliamentary electoral roll, from which the local roll is derived. The Ratepayer Electoral Roll is compiled by Council.
  - (a) Residential Electoral Roll - the Residential Electoral Roll received from the Electoral Enrolment Centre consisted of 32,395 residential electors (ie; people who are registered as Parliamentary electors and reside in the Marlborough District).

- (b) Ratepayer Electoral Roll - the Ratepayer Electoral Roll consists of people (who reside outside the Marlborough District) who have enrolled or been nominated as an elector in respect of a property within the Marlborough District. There were 155 electors on the roll.

### Voting Documents

12. A combined voting document was used for the election and included the Mayoralty, the Ward, and the District Health Board on the one paper. The printing of the voting papers was carried out by Datamail, who were sub-contracted by Electionz.com
13. The envelopes were made available by Datamail to NZ Post ready for posting on Friday, 17 September 2010 and the majority were delivered by Friday 24 September 2010.

16. Of the 18,297 returned envelopes, 1,597 or 8.73% were placed directly into the “drop box” in the foyer of the Council office. This compared to 1279 or 7.86% in 2007.
17. There were 395 envelopes received “gone no address” (GNA). This compares to 397 in 2007.

### **Scrutiny**

18. Scrutiny of the Roll is a process where “returned envelopes with voting papers therein” are marked off the Electoral Roll used to issue voting papers. This process was carried out electronically by wandng the elector bar code through the window of the returned envelope at the processing centre on Christchurch operated by Electionz.com. This process was undertaken under the supervision of a Justice of the Peace.
19. No scrutineers were appointed by any candidates.

### **Progressive Processing**

20. Progressive Processing is that process where “electors’ preferences are input to the “electoral database”. This is done electronically (in the presence of a Justice of the Peace) by entering the electors’ preferences (ie the “numbers”) from each voting document. This operation stored the preferences in a database which was unable to be accessed or totalled until after midday on Saturday 09 October.
21. Progressive Processing commenced on Monday 20 September and continued each day until Saturday 09 October.

### **Publication of Preliminary Results**

22. The preliminary result was published at 2.50 pm on Saturday 09 October 2010.

### **Final Results**

23. After the Special Votes were counted the final vote counts were determined. There were some minor changes to the provisional results but the overall result did not change.
