BikeWalk Marlborough Trust – 49

BikeWalk Marlborough Trust's submission covered projects that they support and recommend for the 2010/11 financial year, a request that specific funding for walking and cycling initiatives of \$100,000 continue for the 2010/11 financial year, a request that the level of funding allocated in the Marlborough Regional Transport Strategy and LTCCP for walking and cycling facilities over future years be retained or increased to enable Action Plan objectives to be implemented in reasonable time frames, and a request for Council to convey to central government that funding for walking and cycling be increased to achieve a more balanced and sustainable approach to transportation infrastructure.

Members agreed that the submission from BikeWalk Marlborough Trust be referred to the Assets and Services Committee for further consideration.

Linkwater Settlers and Hall Committee – 50

The Linkwater Settlers and Hall Committee requested funding of \$50,000 for proposed works.

Members agreed that the request from the Linkwater Settlers and Hall Committee be referred to the Assets and Services Committee for consideration during the impending land subdivision account prioritisation.

Ngakuta Bay Community Association Inc – 51

Members agreed that the funding requests from the Awatere Settlers' Association of \$6,713 for shade and \$3,490 for seating for the Seddon swimming pool be referred to the Assets and Services Committee for consideration during the impending land subdivision account prioritisation.

Clrs Barker/Weetman:
