Our company is required under its resource consents for the Waitata and Kopaua to comply with its King Shag Management Plan as per condition 11.

Please find attached a report done by Rob Schuckard for us on the population census of the King shag fly over in February.

Also attached is a copy of the population modelling carried out by Darryl MacKenzie referenced in Rob's report and a peer review by Rachel McLellan of Wildlands. All three should be considered as part of the overall report.

Please note that we have already implemented the fly over to now occur annually until further notice, this is in addition to the work proposed through the working group. I believe there will be another fly over next week to determine where birds may be roosting/nesting to ensure we are up to date with locations as they do tend to move around a bit with some colonies for example being deserted.

You will also be aware that we are members of the King shag working group consisting of a wide range of participants including council, MPI, DoC, MFA, Forestry and Rob.

These reports will be placed on our website over the next few days.
