Figure 1: Number of total control pest sites visited for control work.

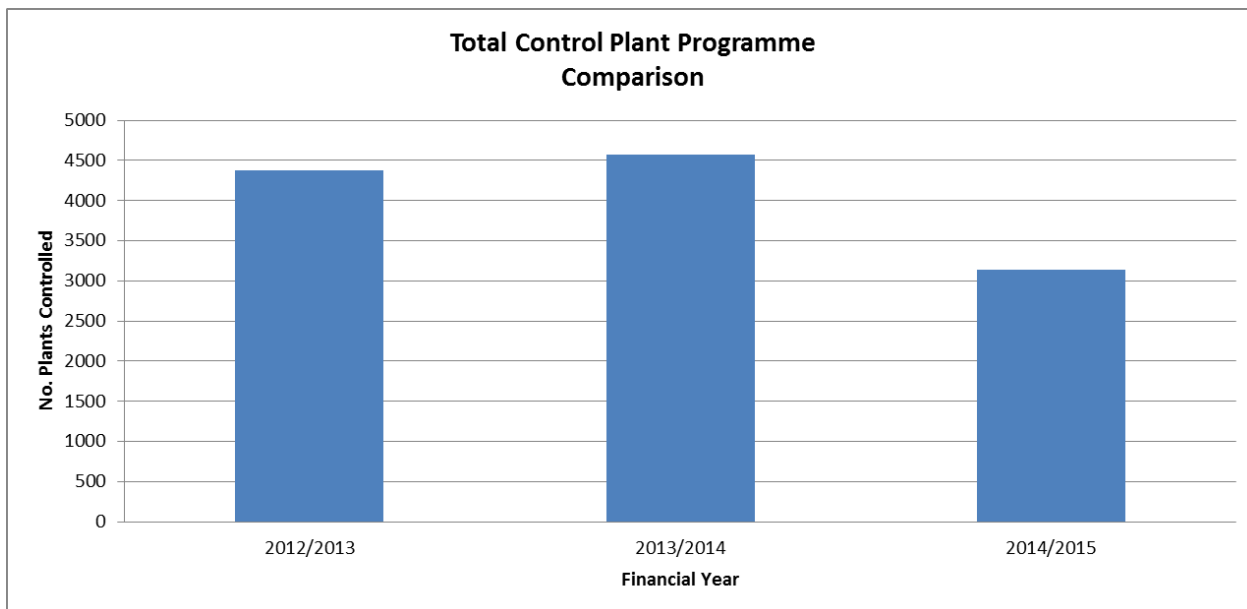


Figure 2: Number of total control pest plants controlled per annum.

Nassella Tussock (E315-004-002-01)

The bulk of the compliance inspections for Nassella Tussock have been completed. Only a small number of priority large properties remain to be inspected.

In general, the level of compliance this season is greatly improved on previous years, with far fewer Notices of Direction required. Biosecurity staff will endeavour to report back to the Committee in early 2015 with a more comprehensive overview of the active compliance programmes run over the 2014/2015 season.

Chilean Needle Grass Action Group (E315-004-003-04)

Biosecurity staff were very appreciative of the support shown at the recent Blenheim A & P Show by members of the Chilean Needle Grass Action Group. Members volunteered their time to 'man the stand' and discuss the importance of being vigilant with those passing through the Conservation Tent.

Regional Pest Management Strategy Review Sub-Committee (E315-002-005-01)

The notes of the Regional Pest Management Review Sub-Committee held on 22 October 2014 are outlined below for the information of the Committee.

There were no documents pre-circulated to the attendees prior to the meeting:

The following items were discussed:

1. Introduction

Sarah explained that the purpose of this meeting was to update the Sub-Committee on progress made by the Biosecurity team in its review of the Regional Pest Management Plan (RPMP) and to set out the proposed approach for the next iteration, as developed thus far.

Jono reminded the attendees there have been substantial changes to legislation in terms of the Biosecurity Act and that Council was aligning this review process with these changes. From the Act, a National Policy Direction (NPD) has been developed and is now waiting on ratification by Parliament and subsequent sign off by the Minister for Primary Industries. The NPD must be ratified before the review can formally progress beyond its current phase. However, in the meantime it has triggered a comprehensive review across all Regional Councils of how each manage pests in their districts and regions, with a view to achieving some level of commonality in the prescribed approaches, e.g. in language within the management plans and service delivery.

Jono explained the Biosecurity team is still in the early stages of the review but have already identified issues relating to some pests species in terms of how they should be managed in the future.

2. Discussion about pest programmes

- a. Examples of pests with issues
 - (i) Wilding conifers
 - (ii) Chilean Needle Grass
- b. New pests
 - (iii) Wallaby
 - (iv) Pest Fish
 - (v) Argentine Ants

Sarah and Jono tabled, and provided a detailed overview of, the following documents:

Material that will form the basis for a discussion document describing for each of the proposed pest species identified in the Marlborough region, why it is considered to be a threat, how it is managed currently and what is proposed going forwards for Councillors consideration.

A proposed programme/approach for:

- Wilding Conifers
- Chilean Needle Grass
- Argentine Ants
- Pest Fish
- Wallaby

Jono explained the term 'Wilding Conifers' will be applied generically to mean any of a specific list of non-native conifer tree species that have established by natural means. The term will be defined as such in the proposed management plan. Jono highlighted the proposed inclusion of Douglas Fir and the proposed exclusion of Radiata Pine from the list of wilding pines.

Clr Oddie asked what the anticipated response from the forestry industry would be. Jono explained that the high risk species were legacy species and not used for plantation forestry.

Alan and Jono explained that the team in assessing each species had to determine whether a regulatory or non-regulatory approach was the most appropriate. For example, through its analysis of wilding Radiata Pine in Marlborough, the team concluded that this species will not meet the criteria for pest species under the Biosecurity Act and so would not fit within the regulatory framework. Therefore, a non-regulatory programme would be most appropriate for this species.

Ross Beech asked whether excluding a species from the RPMP would negatively impact on any community applications for funding specific to the management of those species. Jono and Alan clarified that such species and the related management aspirations would be articulated in the District Plan, and applications for funding could be made via the Long Term Plan. A non-regulatory strategy will need to be prepared in conjunction with the regulatory strategy. They did not anticipate any impediment to funding applications due to exclusion from the regulatory approach.

Jono added that the regulatory framework prescribed a structured approach to pest management. Whereas a non-regulatory approach enabled greater flexibility and access to alternative funding sources. Non-regulatory approaches could also reflect community aspirations.

Jono went on to outline the issues being faced in undertaking a review of the Chilean Needle Grass (CNG) regulatory programme. There are two ways the regulatory programme could be structured:

1. Have a single programme and objective and manage the three components at an operational level.
2. Structure three programmes with three specific objectives within the Proposed Plan.

Jono indicated a preference for the second option as it provided for much more transparency and ability to monitor progress.

Alan sought clarification in that the underlying obligation must rest with the landholder and the messages having a standalone service delivery type programme may deliver.

Jono clarified the reasoning behind proposing Council deliver the control work for isolated and new infestations is to ensure top quality control is achieved to prevent establishment. There will be strict operational criteria ensuring the size of programme does not escalate with an ever increasing size of the service delivery components.

Jono finished on two relatively straight forward proposed inclusions – wallabies and pest fish. It was outlined by Jono that wallabies have been removed off the Wild Animal Control Act and are now required to be

managed under the Biosecurity Act. They are not known to be established in Marlborough and the proposed programme with endeavour to keep it that way. The same is proposed for a number of invasive freshwater fish species broadly termed 'Pest Fish'.

It was highlighted by Alan that for the work relating to Pest Fish will require a close working relationship with DOC for operational delivery.

Over the course of Jono and Sarah's presentation, the attendees discussed the proposed strategies and programmes. The Sub-Committee endorsed the approach developed by the Biosecurity team thus far, recognising that it was in an early stage of development.

3. Cost Benefit Analysis (CBA) work required

This item was deferred to the next meeting.

4. Proposed Biosecurity framework

Jono tabled, and provided an explanation of, a diagram setting out the proposed biosecurity framework.

Jono discussed the desire to develop a Biosecurity Strategy that houses this framework and would assist the community in understanding the nature of Council's leadership for pest management.

5. Other Matters

There were no other matters.

Environmental Science

Blenheim Gasworks (E355-006-001-01)

(Report prepared by Rachel Rait)

Pattle Delamore Partners Limited (PDP) was engaged by Council to undertake monitoring of a series of groundwater monitoring wells, which were installed at the former gasworks site on Park Terrace, Blenheim, in 1997. Five of the wells are located on the site and three are between the site and the Taylor River. The wells were installed to monitor impacts from gasworks waste on the shallow groundwater and potential impacts on the Taylor River from the discharge of groundwater.

The results indicate that there are no significant health or environmental risks as a result of the ongoing migration of compounds associated with the gasworks. Sample monitoring will continue on a three yearly schedule.

WasteMinz Conference (E355-004-008-05)

Alec McNeill and Rachel Rait attended the 26th annual WasteMINZ conference (21-23 October 2014). The conference covered Waste Management, Recycling and Contaminated Land Areas, with goals to reduce the harmful effects of waste and improve the efficiency of resource use. The conference included numerous presentations and trade exhibits that were informative. The discussion with counterparts from other councils was valuable.

Rachel Rait attended the workshop "From Go to Whoa: Assessing and consenting a contaminated site under the NES". This workshop was attended by a large number of regional, unitary and local authorities, consultants and Central Government representatives and provided a place to compare notes and discuss best practice. The workshop covered:

- An understanding of other stakeholder drivers, perspectives and responsibilities.

- Undertake fit for purpose PSI and DSI investigations, which will satisfy client needs and meet regulator requirements.
- Understand and develop a conceptual site model to allow for risk-based decision making.
- Assess PSI and DSI reports, identify gaps and make risk-based decisions.
- Develop conditions of consent to enable efficient site operations and allow for effective compliance monitoring.

Council Attends Public Events - A & P Show / Garden Marlborough Fête (C230-001-M05)

Staff attended the Marlborough A & P Show held on Friday and Saturday 7 & 8 November 2014 and occupied several spaces in the Conservation Tent. Displays focussed on:

- Marlborough Landscape Group - general landscape issues and wilding pines
- Significant Natural Areas and the Tui to Town habitat restoration projects
- Water Quality in Marlborough
- Chilean Needle Grass awareness

This was a great opportunity to talk to the general public and explain some of the Council programmes and projects. Representatives of the Marlborough Landscape Group and the Chilean Needle Grass Action Group assisted Council staff in staffing these displays and interacting with the public.

Participation also enabled positive interaction with other groups involved in working on various environmental issues in Marlborough. These included government agencies, like the Department of Conservation and Ministry of Primary Industries, as well as community groups, like Forest and Bird, Fish and Game, the QEII National Trust and Kaipupu Point Restoration Project.

The Marlborough Landscape Group also shared a stall with the Department of Conservation at the Garden Marlborough Fete on Sunday 9 November 2014. The focus was on general landscape issues and the Tui to Town habitat restoration project.

Water Resource Update and Summary - November 2014 (E320-001-001)

This report is prepared using data from Council's environmental monitoring network, as well as sites operated by NIWA and the Marlborough Research Centre.

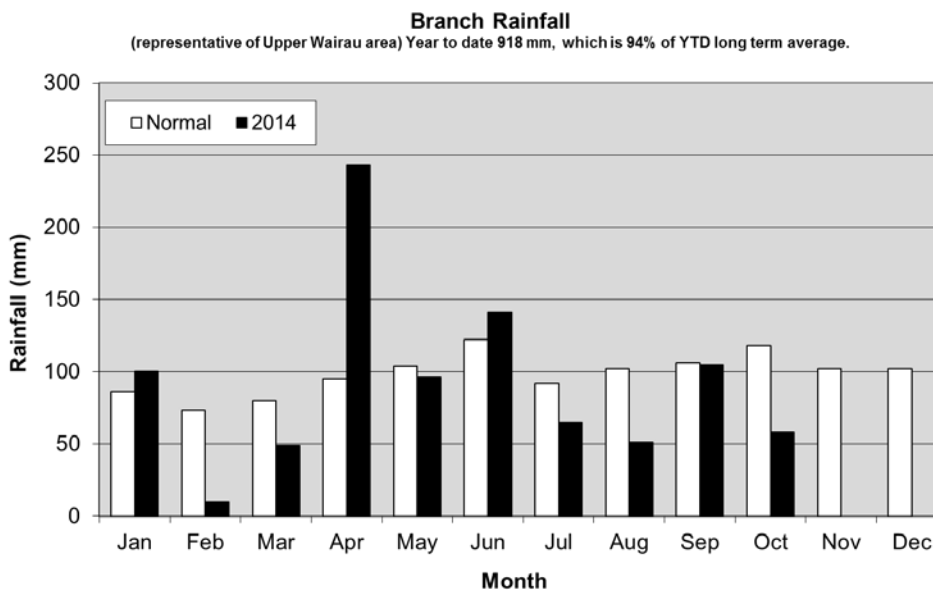
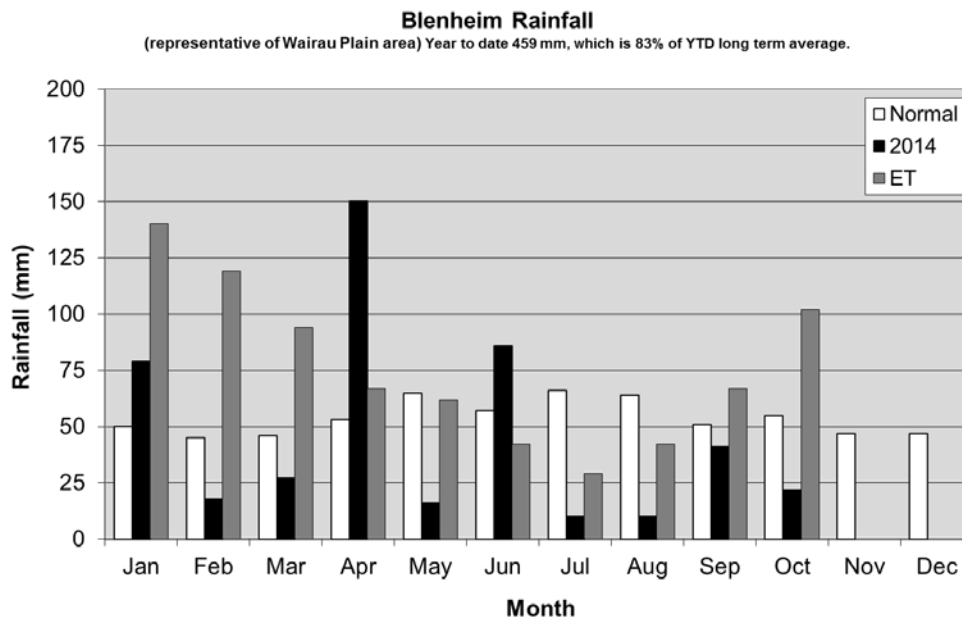
Executive Summary

With four consecutive months of below average rainfall, the district is heading toward a much drier than normal season. No significant rainfall has been received so far in November, and although an unsettled period is forecast for the week 17-21 November, it does not appear to be enough to reverse the current decline in soil moisture. In an interesting contrast, river flows are still reasonable, the result of weather patterns which have seen regular rainfall on the West Coast, with spill over into the headwaters of the main Marlborough rivers. As at the time of writing this report, all major rivers have water available in all classes, including class C, so irrigation based producers are probably still feeling comfortable, with no restrictions in supply likely in the short term. However, farming activities which do not include irrigation will be seeing decrease in pasture growth as a result of soil moisture deficits, which are many weeks ahead of most recent seasons. Where the season will head to will be dictated by weather patterns in the next few weeks.

Rainfall

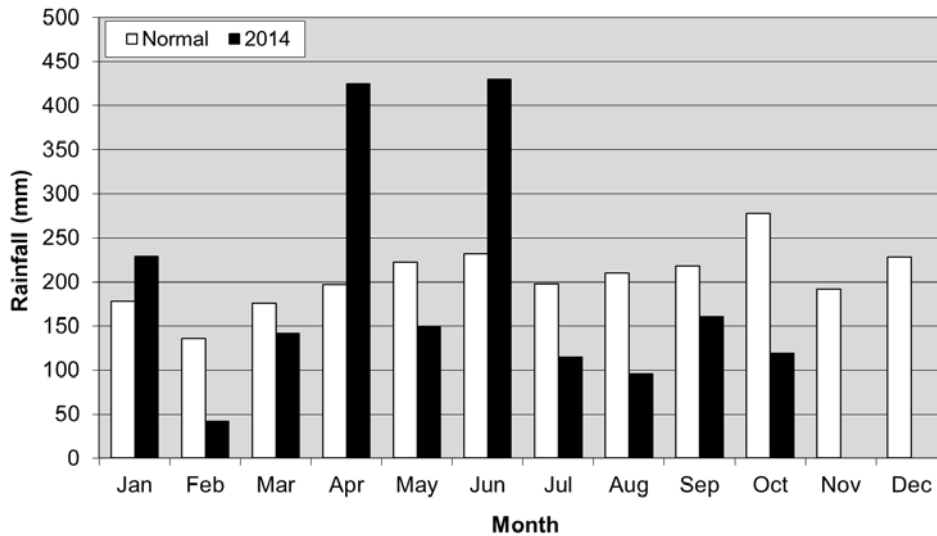
Rainfall throughout the district was well below average in all areas, and evapotranspiration continues to climb, meaning a further reduction in soil moisture levels, some of which will now be at basement levels.

The following graphs show the monthly rainfall totals for 2014 at four representative sites, compared to the long term monthly averages for those sites. The Blenheim graph also shows the actual monthly evapo-transpiration (ET). The difference between monthly rain and ET indicates the likely soil moisture gain or loss.



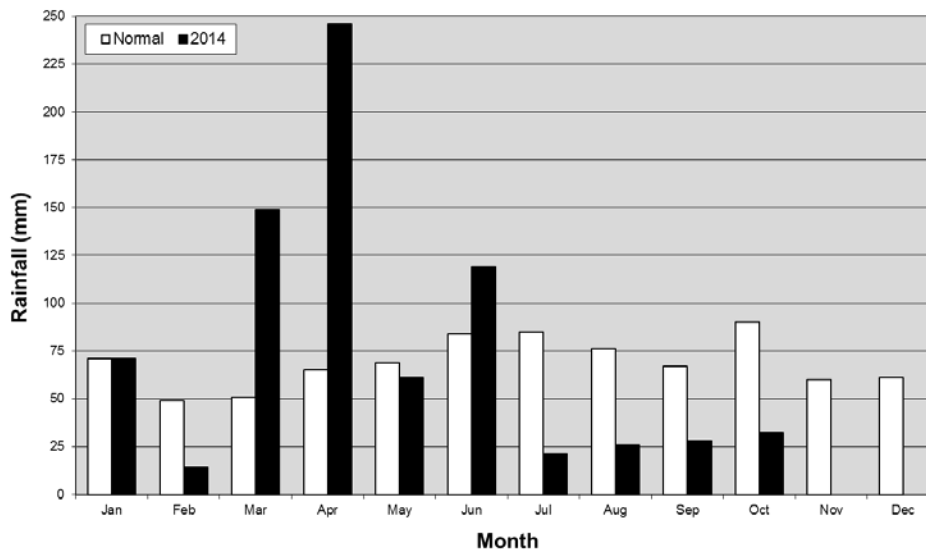
Tunakino Rainfall

Monthly Harbours Incident Summary (H100-004-001-14)

(Report prepared by the Harbour Master)

The Committee will be aware that staff deal with a variety of incidents that occur within the Sounds on a regular basis. Some of the incidents are reported in the media due to their nature, but the majority are reports received by the Harbour Master's office.

With the introduction of the Port and Harbour Safety Code and the requirement to undertake a risk assessment, staff have reviewed the Harbours Incident database and revised it to the extent that retrieval and manipulation of statistical information is simplified and that standard reporting on a month-by-month basis is made easier. Current cumulative incident totals are as from the start of the current calendar year.

Attached to this item is the summary of the incident reports that have occurred since the Committee's last regular meeting. It should be noted that incidents are generally up to the day prior to the agenda closure. Staff will be on hand to outline and explain the data, however, information as it is set out will generally form the basis of the report.

A variety of incidents occur and these are recorded with a view to keeping the Committee informed, identifying potential trends as well as using the data to plan educational initiatives.

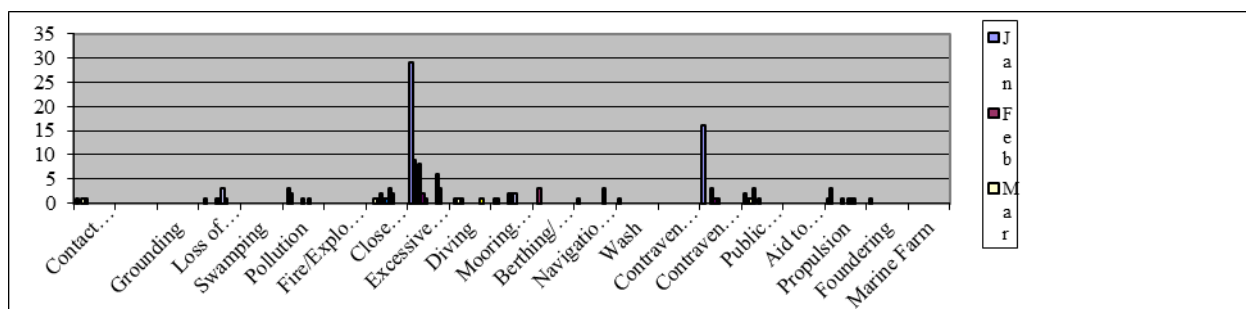

The Harbour Master will review/investigate all navigational incidents reported. As incidents occur, they will be listed on this document. Each incident remains 'live' until such time as the investigation/review is complete and the file on that particular incident is closed. Some incidents will be investigated/reviewed by the Harbours staff, some jointly with Maritime New Zealand whilst others will be dealt with by the Authority alone.

Incidents will fall within three categories, Safety Incidents (SI) and Navigational Occurrences (NO) and Pollution Incidents (PI).

Building Control Group (Building Consent Authority) activity

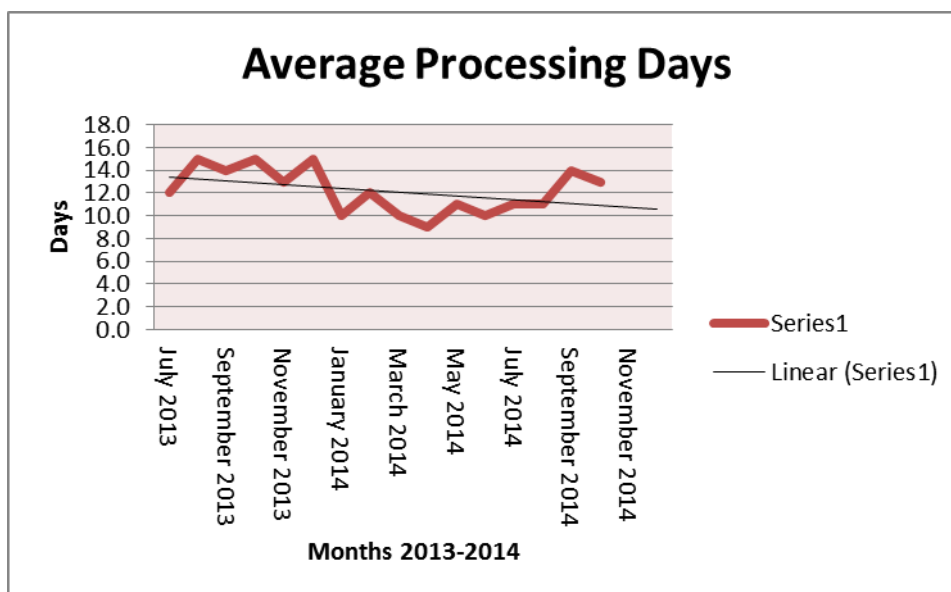
Building Consents, issuing and receiving are slightly down on Septembers figures. However, the team is busy at present and working very hard to maintain its statutory requirements. The past two short weeks have created the normal issues but with concerted efforts on processing we are managing to reduce the work load.

Consents issued for the month of October

- Total of 91 consents. With a total value of \$10,650,539.03
- This included 17 new dwellings with a value of \$6,338,441.57
- 99% of consents have been issued within 20 working days with only one consent issued outside the statutory timeframe. That consent was issued in 21 days. The average processing time is 13 days.

Inspections undertaken for the month of October

There have been a total of 422 inspections undertaken with an average booking time over the month of 1.7 days.

Issuing of Code Compliance Certificates (CCC) for October

The group issued 109 CCs to a value of \$9,631,750.00. This included 17 new dwellings with a value of \$4,814,260.00.

Building Control Group (Territorial Authority) activity

This year's "**Fencing of Swimming Pool**" site audits continue. Kevin Maitland of Property check has completed 77 inspections since starting last month (to the first week of November) and of those completed only 7 properties requires a recheck to confirm compliance.

Compliance and Building Warrant of Fitness role: Tony Adamson will commence work as a full time Building Control Officer (TA) on the 5 January. This is a change from the current secondment agreement with Davidson Group where Tony is only available 2.5 days a week. The full time position will allow the required site inspections to start which will assist with cost recovery.

Other Issues

Building Control Officers Diplomas: An award ceremony was held on the 14 November. This signified that all of the original applicants (BCOs) have completed their diplomas this year. The diplomas have been achieved by working through the Skills Organisation. Skills has advised the group that it is the first BCA going through the Skills system to achieve this.

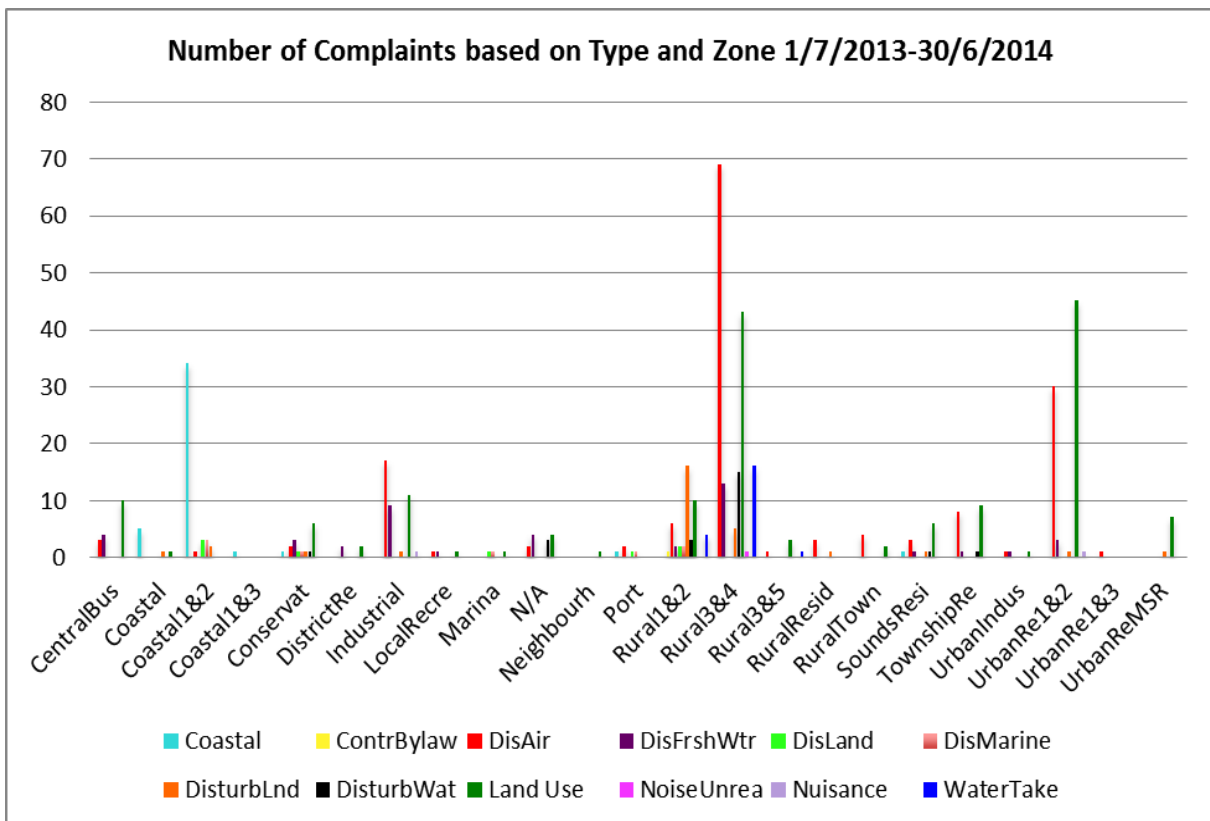

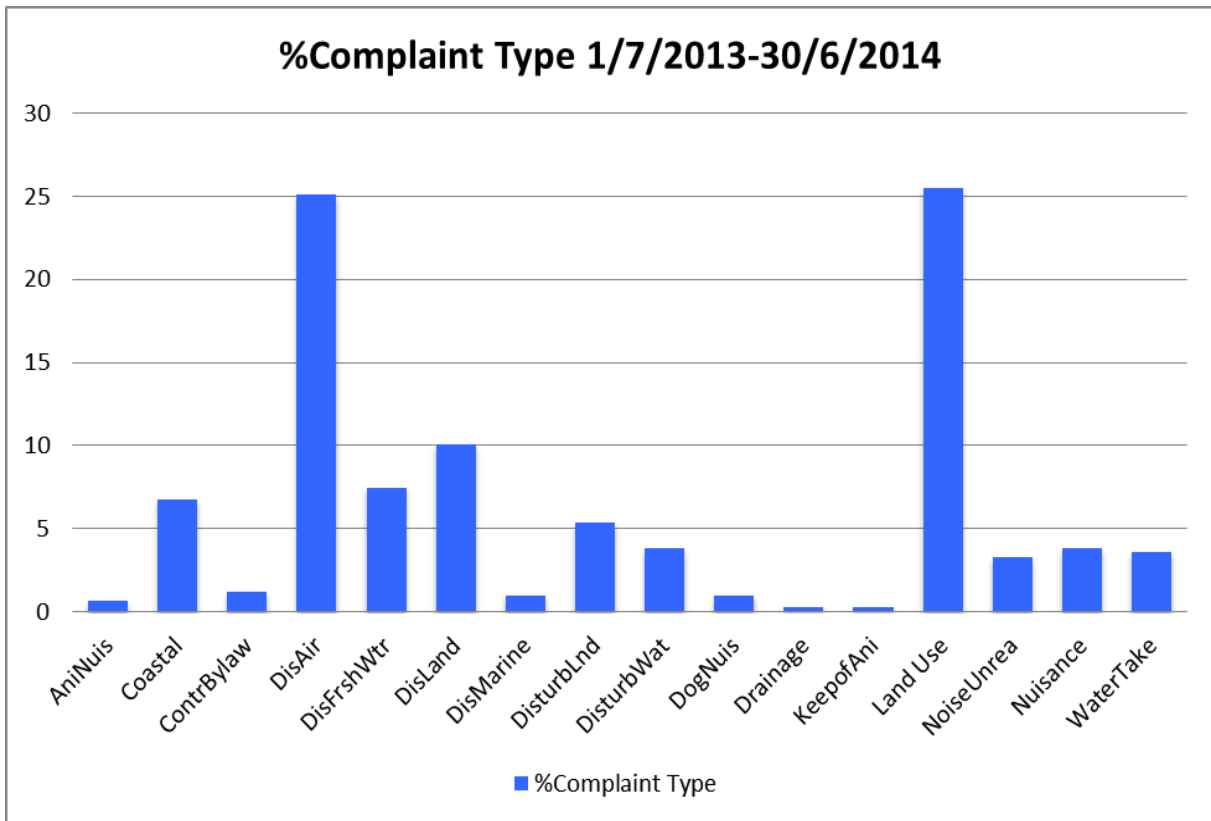

Environmental Protection

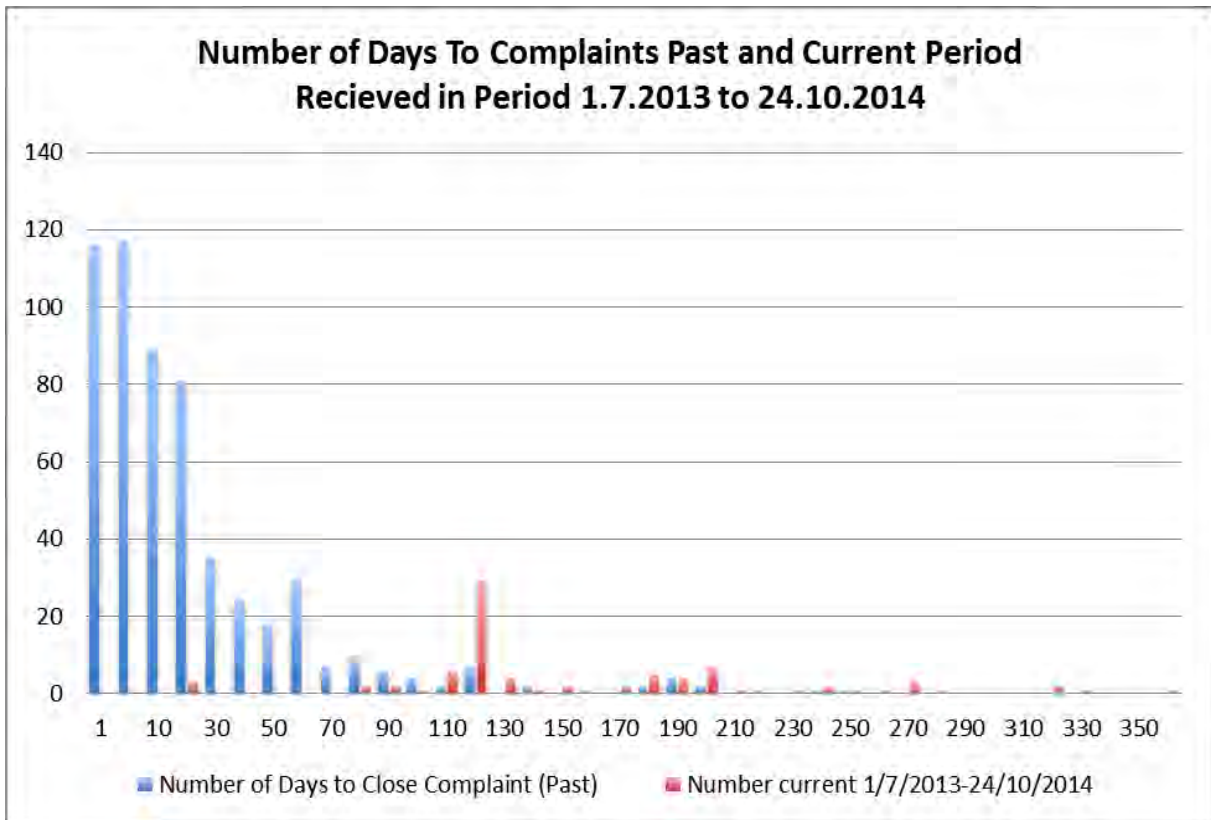
- The compliance group is currently reviewing its activities, strategies and objectives.
- The group has analysed its complaints activities to understand current demands.
- Analysis has included a breakdown on the types and frequency of complaints, the zones and frequency of type of complaints and the length of time different types of complaints are taking the group to resolve.



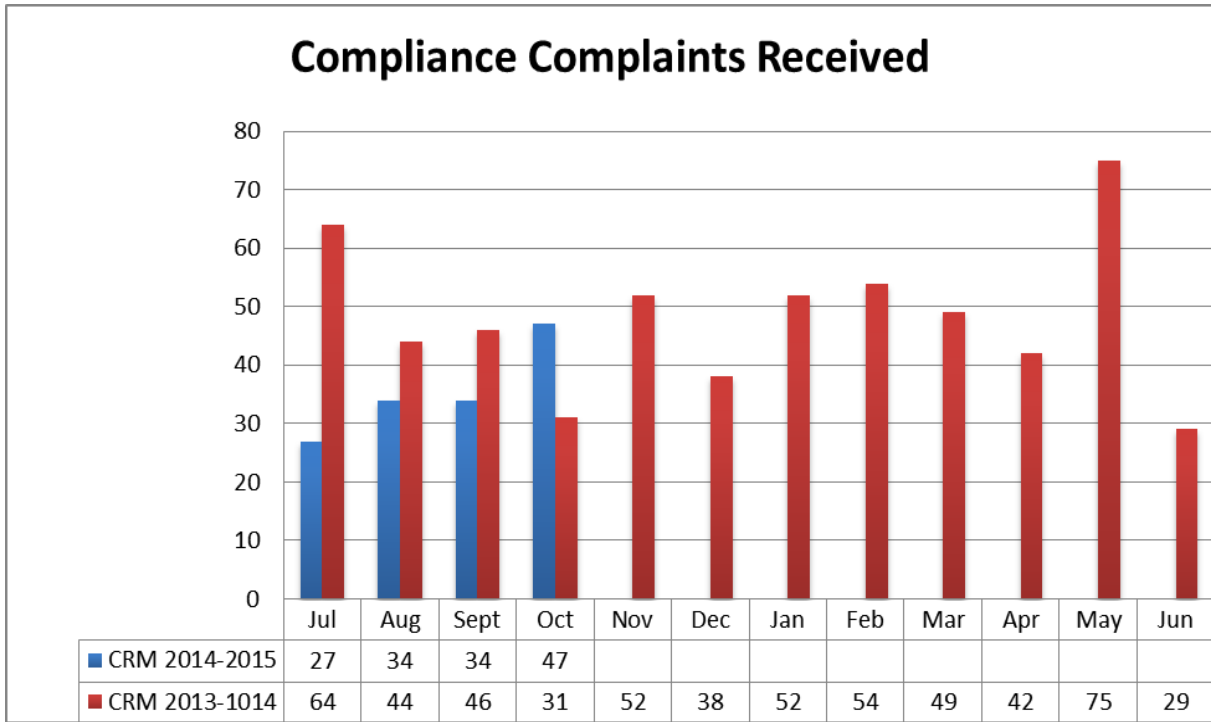
- This breakdown provides some detail on where most complaints are happening and what type of complaints are frequent in which zones. This information is relevant for policy, planning and monitoring activities.



- Over 50% of the group complaints arise from “Discharge to Air” and “Land Use” activities. Further breakdown of these areas will be investigated to identify education and best practice opportunities.



- 36% of Complaints closed within 5 days of receipt
50% of Complaints closed within 10 days of receipt
68% of Complaints closed within 30 days of receipt
- The complexity of individual complaints impact on the time needed to resolve the issue.
- October has had an increased numbers of complaints compared to last October. Total complaints received are tracking comparably to last years numbers.

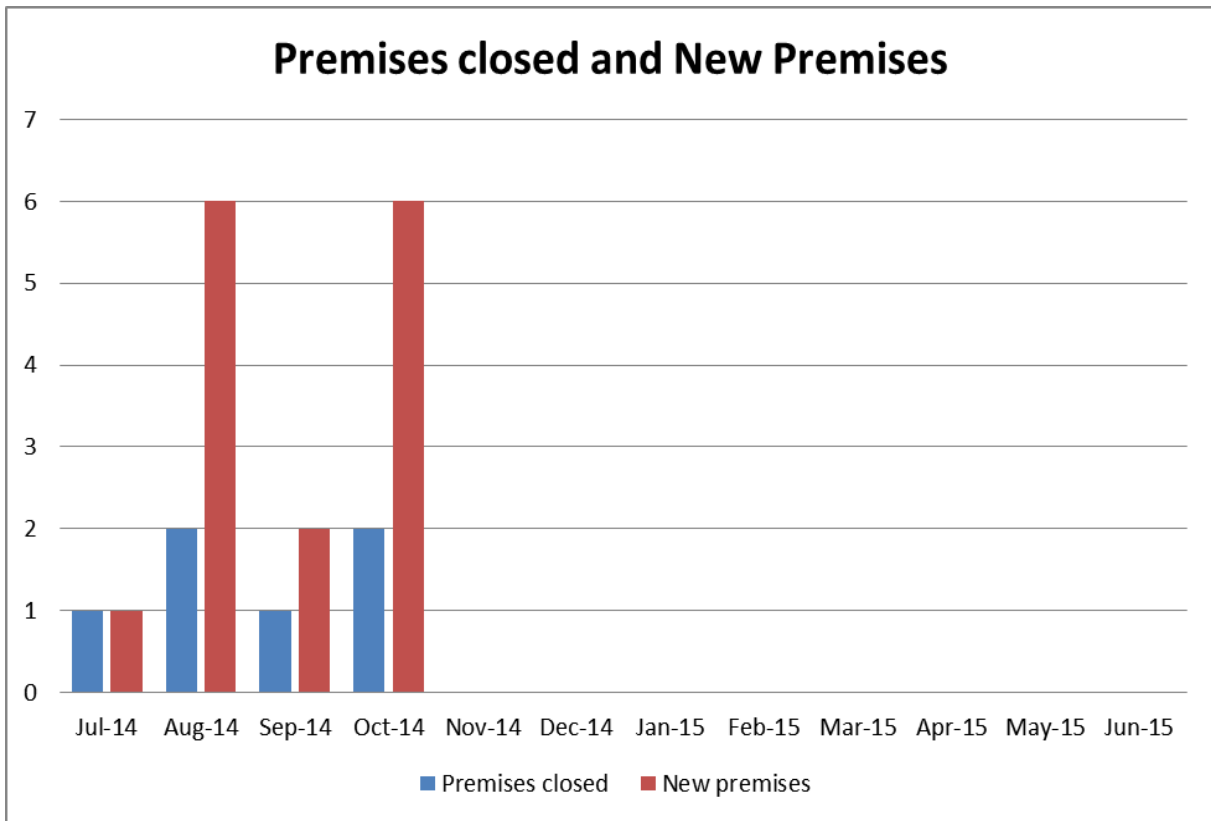

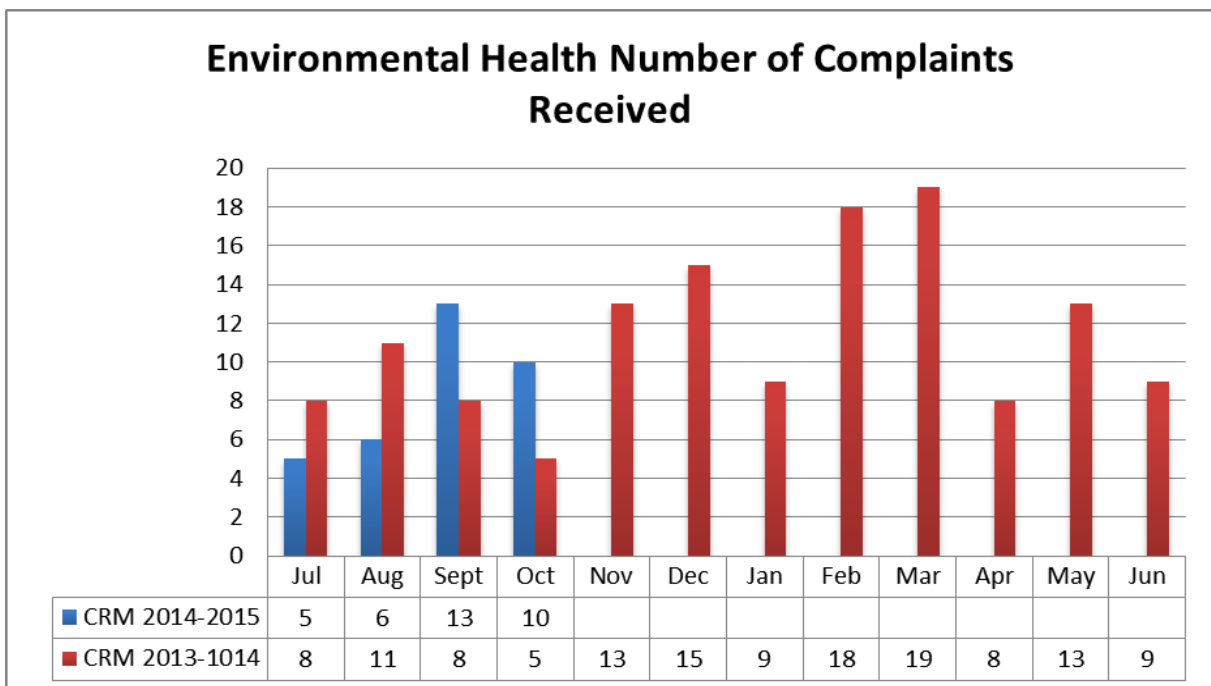
- On-going enforcement activities continue to place extra demand on staff time and remove staff from routine activities.

Environmental Health Section

- Food Act 2014 Update: Environmental Health staff recently attended a meeting with Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) representatives. Some information was provided on the proposed regulations under the Food Act 2014. Local authorities have been named as the agency responsible for registering National Programmes and may undertake verification on these Programmes. This is in addition to Council's responsibilities to register and verify template Food Control Plans.
- The Environmental Health Section will be looking at the impact of this increased activity on resourcing and service delivery.
- There continues to be an increase in the number of premises registered with Council.



- Environmental Health total complaint numbers received are tracking comparably to last year's numbers.

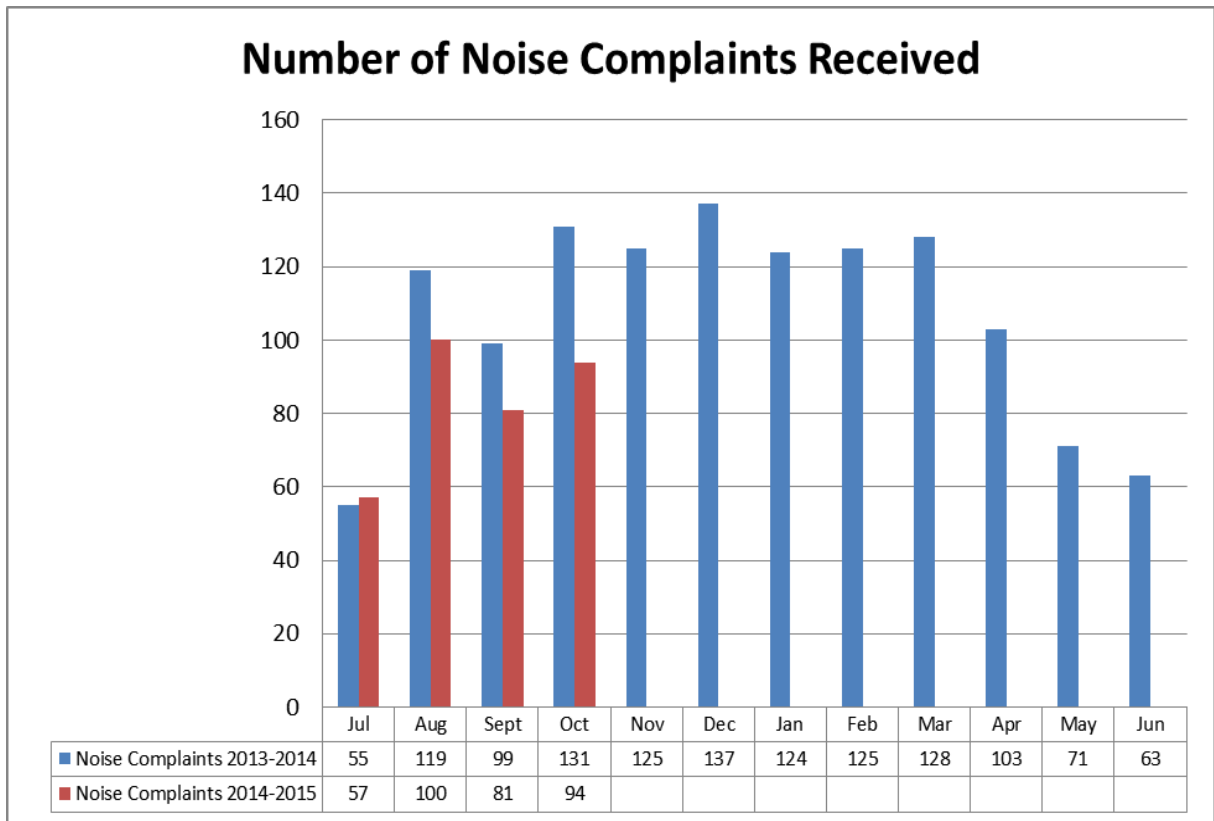

- The Environmental Health Section is currently short staffed. Applications have closed for a replacement Environmental Health Officer. Applications are currently being reviewed.

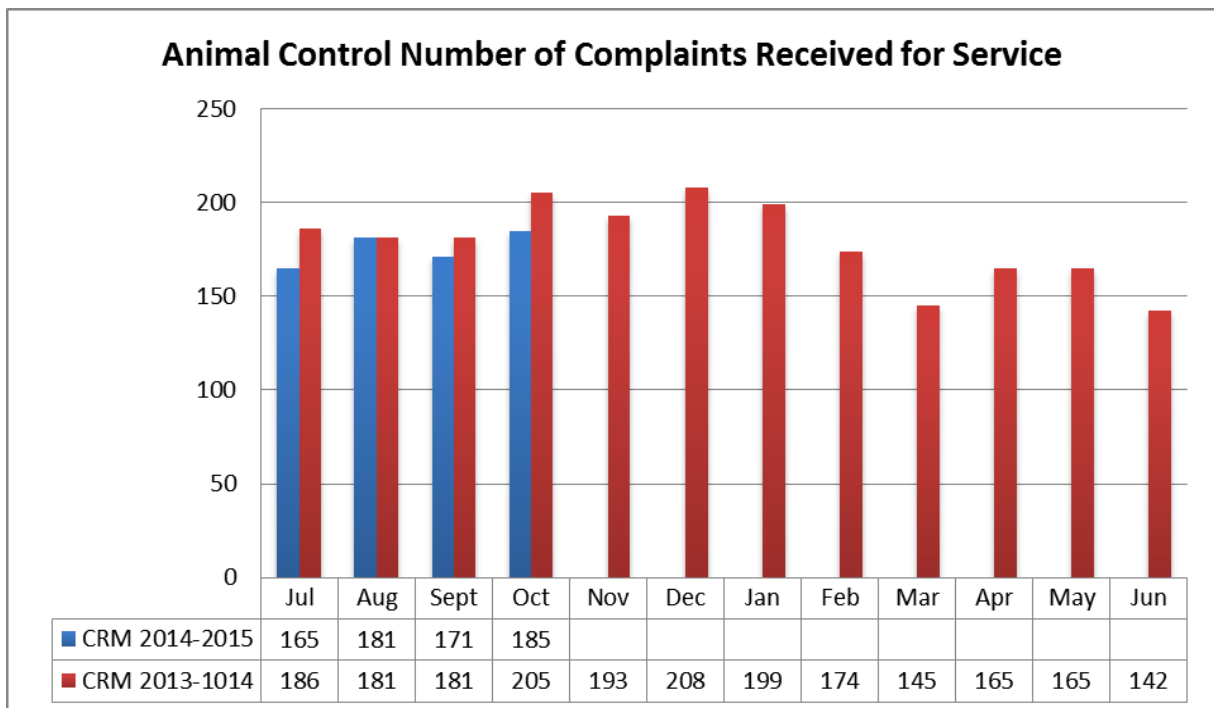

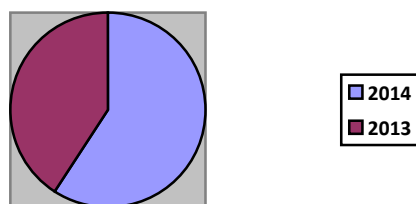
Resource Consents Section

- Over the first seventeen weeks of the new financial year Council has received 418 applications for resource consent. Of that total 380 were applications for resource consent. Council also received 35 applications under section 127 (variations to resource consent conditions) and three objections under section 357. This represents, on average, 24 applications a week and a 45% increase in resource consent applications received over the same period in 2013. This percentage increase is likely to be even more significant in the next report as Council received 47 applications for resource consent in the last week. To date the average number of applications received weekly is 24. Last year over the same period the average number of applications received weekly was 16.
- Over the first 13 weeks of the new financial year Council has issued 371 applications. Of that total 343 were applications for resource consent. The remaining 28 were variations to resource consent conditions. This represents a 24% increase in resource consent applications issued over the same period in 2013. To date all applications in 2014 have been processed within statutory timeframes. For the calendar year 2013 there were 806 applications for resource consent. That number was exceeded in week 41 in 2014 and the number is now over 900.

- There are nine hearings scheduled for November and December. There is a mix of marine farms, water, coastal and subdivision applications being heard, with three being heard by independent commissioners and six by the Hearings Committee.
- Duty planner enquiries are continuing at a high volume. The number of enquires have increased at a similar rate to the number of applications received. Increases in the number of applications have been across the five application types with particularly high numbers being received by the land use and coastal planners.
