NOTICE OF PERSON'S WISH TO BE PARTY TO PROCEEDINGS

Section 274, Resource Management Act 1991

Name of Person who wishes to be Party

- 1 Wine Marlborough Limited ("Wine Marlborough") wishes to be a party to the following proceedings: ENV-2020-CHC-000035, an appeal by the Nelson-Marlborough Fish and Game Council against parts of the Marlborough District Council's decision on the proposed Marlborough Environment Plan.
- 2 Wine Marlborough says that it is:
 - (a) a person who has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has (as a body representing the collective interests of wine industry in the region); and
 - (b) a person who made a submission about the subject matter of the proceedings.

Trade competition

- 3 Wine Marlborough is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991.

The Proceedings

- 4 Wine Marlborough is interested in part of the proceedings.
- 5 The part of the proceedings Wine Marlborough is interested in is those parts relating to:
 - (a) Chapter 5 of Volume 1 – Allocation of Freshwater Resources; and
 - (b) Appendix 6 – Environmental Flows and Levels

- 6 Wine Marlborough is interested in the following particular issues:
- (a) Policy 5.2.4;
 - (b) Policy 5.2.5;
 - (c) Policy 5.2.6;
 - (d) Policy 5.2.7;
 - (e) Policy 5.2.8;
 - (f) Policy 5.2.13;
 - (g) Policy 5.2.14;
 - (h) Policy 5.2.15;
 - (i) Policy 5.2.25;
 - (j) Policy 5.3.10; and
 - (k) Appendix 6

Relief sought

- 7 Wine Marlborough opposes the relief sought because:
- (a) The proposed relief does not provide for efficient resource management.
 - (b) The only benefit to the environment of the proposed relief would be a potential increase in the size of trout. This would be at the expense of the Marlborough wine industry.
 - (c) The wine industry is a \$1.9 billion export industry. 77% of that industry arises in Marlborough. The proposed amendment would significantly reduce the economic activity of this industry for little environmental gain.

Dispute resolution

- 8 Wine Marlborough agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceedings.

Note to person wishing to be a party

You must lodge the original and 1 copy of this notice with the Environment Court within 15 working days after–

- the period for lodging a notice of appeal ends, if the proceedings are an appeal; or
- the decision to hold an inquiry, if the proceedings are an inquiry; or
- the proceedings are commenced, in any other case.

Your right to be a party to the proceedings in the Court may be limited by the trade competition provisions in section 274(1) and Part 11A of the Resource Management Act 1991. The notice must be signed by you or on your behalf.

You must serve a copy of this notice on the relevant local authority and the person who commenced the proceedings within the same 15 working day period and serve copies of this notice on all other parties within 5 working days after that period ends.

However, you may apply to the Environment Court under section 281 of the Resource Management Act 1991 for a waiver of the above timing or service requirements (*see form 38*).
