- 1. We, Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Kuia Trust wish to be a party to the following proceedings:
- 2. The Following appeals to the Marlborough Environment Plan by the Marlborough District Council;
 - Heritage New Zealand ENV-2020-CHC-36
 - Te Rūnanga o Rangitane o Wairau ENV-2020-CHC-39
 - Te Rūnanga o Kaikoūra and Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu ENV-2020-CHC-46
 - Te Atiawa o Te-Waka-a-Maui Trust ENV-2020-CHC-43
 - Nelson Marlborough Fish and Game ENV-2020-CHC-35
 - Department of Conservation ENV-2020-CHC-42
 - Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand Incorporated ENV-2020-CHC-64
- 3. We are an iwi authority which has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has because, Ngāti Kuia are signatories to the Treaty of Waitangi for the purposes of fulfilling the requirements of Section 8 of the Act.
- 4. Ngāti Kuia made a submission on the Marlborough Environment Plan.
- 5. We are not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991.

- 6. We are interested in the following particular issues:
 - a. Matters pertaining to the protection of heritage, particularly Māori and iwi heritage.
 - b. Matters relating to freshwater and Te Mana o Te Wai.
 - c. Matters relating to indigenous biodiversity.

7. We either support or neutral the relief sought because—

- a. The matters require collaborative resolution. We support the purpose of the appeals and support in the most part, the relief sort by the other parties but as there is a difference in the relief sort by the various parties, we are not in a position to articulate accurately which parts are supported or opposed by each of the parties to the appeals.
- b. Ngāti Kuia support greater protection of sites of significance within the plan and all parties acknowledge the current plan decision do not achieve this. Ngāti kuia seek a broader range of sites to be protected. For te Mana o Te Wai to be implemented and incorporated in to the plan and for indigenous biodiversity that has cultural significance to be managed in accordance with Tikanga Māori.
- c. The points of the appeals are matters in which Ngāti Kuia have significant interest and are matters on which we participated in the hearings.
- d. The points of appeal address areas of the plan where the principles of Te Tiriti have not been taken into account, and are therefore inconsistent with Section 8 of the RMA.
- e. The Matters are inconsistent with, or ineffective at addressing Issues of Significance to Marlborough's Tangata Whenua in Chapter 3 of the plan.
- f. The relief sort will better address those Issues in Chapter 3.
- g. The use of s274 to become a party to similar appeals allows for a collaborative solution on specific matters to be accomplished. This is more in line with Tikanga Maori.
