





The Audit

Initiative	Description
Wetlands Walkway	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Build a board walk which would give pedestrians the opportunity to experience the wetlands from Mahakipara Road to the cemetery including a viewing jetty This would create a connection with the Link pathway to Pictou and with the Teawaroa national pathway. It would provide an alternative route for children away from main road and strengthens the towns connection to the wetland
Neil street feasibility study	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Commission further work to be done on the beautification of Neil street and providing a clear connection from the main road to the Marina, foreshore. The existing Urbanism Plus designs are only at a concept stage and go beyond what is required to improve the Neil Street connection to the Marina
Pedestrian refuge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Introduce a pedestrian refuge on the main road outside Havelock school which would create a safer crossing environment for pupils and their families and would also slow traffic down coming into Havelock
Havelock community gym	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create a community gym in the community's sports pavilion giving access to any community member wanting to use it at an affordable membership rate. This requires approximately \$30,000 to purchase the equipment and security requirements.
Squash courts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Build a small community squash complex next to the sports pavilion so that existing showers and toilets can be used
Pelorus FM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create a local FM radio station run by volunteers that would serve the needs of the local community through announcements and local business advertising
Havelock gateway	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create a new gateway experience including signage and beautification to enhance the experience of entering Havelock from both directions



BREAKDOWN OF COSTS

Stage 1: Construction and materials

Wetland Boardwalk c. 140m @ \$300m + GST = \$48,300

Dryland Walkway c. 400m @\$230m + GST = \$105,800

Stage 2: Construction and materials


Wetland Boardwalk c. 80m @ \$300 + GST = \$27,600

Viewing Platform c 4m2 @ \$1,500m2 + GST = \$6,900

Key Changes to HCA Constitution:

- Minimum 5 Committee members
- Maximum 10 Committee members
- Quorum 50% + 1
- Committee to be made up of 6 community organisation appointees and 4 elected members

Community Organisations to Appoint Committee Members:

- Havelock School Board of Trustees
- Pelorus Promotions Inc
- Ngati Kuia (local iwi representative)
- Havelock & Sounds Anglican Parish
- Pelorus Area Health Trust
- Marlborough District Council
