Motuweka / Havelock Pathway

Update: 17 July 2020

Work started on the new Motuweka/Havelock Pathway on 1 July at the entrance to the Havelock Cemetery on Slogan Street. A construction team from the Link Pathway Trust are undertaking the work, along with a couple of local volunteers on most days.

Over the last two weeks the team have surveyed a line for the pathway to follow, cut vegetation and benched a pathway across the slope of the hill to the west of the cemetery.

They have spread a base of gravel along this path to give them a robust surface to use as it will receive a lot of use over the next two weeks as we cart material down to the estuary.

At the edge of the estuary, the path splits in two, with a short section heading east to join up with the existing Motuweka Pathway and the main pathway heading west along the narrow spit of land across the estuary.

This spit has now been cleared of gorse, grass and soft soil and is ready for a base course of rock. Over the next ten days 200 cubic metres of rock will be moved onsite.

There have been a number of interested locals visiting the site, including a visit by the Havelock Community Association. Everyone seems very excited by the progress.
