# walkways

We all know that getting out in the fresh air is good for body and mind. Blenheim has great weather and good trails into town, so head out with friends to catch up on news, or take some time out on your own.

## into the CBD

You'll find raised yellow dots at crossings, which are designed to provide a safer way for people using mobility scooters, wheelchairs and prams, and for the sight-impaired.



## the quays

The Quays Riverside Park is a perfect link between the Taylor River and downtown Blenheim, ensuring your riverside journey ends up in the heart of town, with access to cafes and markets.

## seymour square

Seymour Square is a lovely park two minutes from the town centre. It has picturesque floral gardens, a memorial fountain and a historic stone clock tower.



## taylor river reserve

With its beautiful old trees and groves of native plantings, the Taylor River Reserve is a wonderful trail into the heart of Blenheim. It has approximately 4.6km of concrete pathway and ramp access from The Quays, Nelson Street, Henry Street, Monro Street and Burleigh Rd. Please note that narrow gauge railway tracks cross the path on a few occasions. Steep ramps are marked on the map. Do not use this reserve when there is flooding.



## pollard park

You can journey from Seymour Square to the beautiful Pollard Park via a marked walkway. Here you'll find winding pathways through 25 hectares of wooded parkland and rose gardens. Please note that this route requires crossing Nelson Street then ascending a steep ramp.
