6. General Business Including updates from:

Fern McGaw - Network Technician, Marlborough Roads

- Work on Waikawai crossings has commenced to be more accessible and user friendly.
- Work on the causeway out to the wetland in Havelock is complete.
- The path to the lookout in Picton is complete.

Building Control Update – Brendon Robertson/Bill East

- Building Control is looking into building for dementia not currently in the building code
 but we need to think about what makes buildings better. Commencing with in-house
 training and then to go out to the general design fraternity in Marlborough to talk about
 this subject. Design standards talk about disabilities focused on wheelchair issues and
 not always physiologic issues.
- The Building Control Team spent many hours with the designers of the new library discussing the main stairs but could not force the accessibility and the inclusion of handrails. The symbols for the signs for accessibility at the Library are to be changed in time for the official opening.

Parks and Open Spaces Update – Jane Tito

- Any issues with overhanging growth on street streets, please report to Council.
- Work on the pedestrianisation of London Quay in Picton being carried out will improve accessibility.
- Up-grades to footpaths and pedestrian crossings on High Street and access to the shops on Wyneham Street together with improved disability parks.
- Jamie Lyall, Property and Community Facilities Manager at Council is working with Carol Taylor working with Marlborough Girls College to advise what is the best solution for the changing facilities at the Library.

7. Any Other Business

- Nigel called Marlborough Roads about a No Right Turn sign on Seymour Street, near the Ambulance Station that cannot be seen because of an overgrown hedge. Fern will check.
- Diane queried the length of time that accessible public toilets are locked before automatically opening and if it is possible to change. Jane will check.
- Robyn has received a call from the friend of a lady who had tripped and was seriously injured outside the Haven Café in Redwoodtown. Cars were parked right outside the café, although there are yellow lines but they are faded. The caller should contact Countdown Supermarket and Brendon also suggested the contacting Robinsons, the owners of the carpark. Brendon will pass on the details Robyn to pass to the caller.
- Robyn has also received a query from Greypower regarding a trip hazard at the entrance into WINZ. As this is private land the owners will have to be contacted. Robyn will investigate further.
- Hularii queried the swipe card access for the toilet at the Library and the baby change table.
 Jane will come back to Hularii.
- Sue mentioned the uneven pavers outside WINZ near the river. Bill will check.
- Sue discussed Total Mobility Cards for Picton –she will check with Sharon when she returns from leave.
