## NOTICE OF WAKATŪ INCORPORATION'S WISH TO BE PARTY TO PROCEEDINGS

Section 274, Resource Management Act 1991

TO: The Registrar

### Name of Person who wishes to be Party

- Wakatū Incorporation wishes to be a party to the following proceedings: Environmental Defence Society Incorporated v Marlborough District Council ENV-220-CHC-67, which is an appeal against parts of the Marlborough District Council's decision on the proposed Marlborough Environment Plan.
- Wakatū Incorporation (Wakatū) is a Māori incorporation pursuant to Te Ture Whenua Māori Act 1993. With businesses based in Nelson and Marlborough, Wakatū has approximately 4,000 shareholders who are those families who descend from the customary Māori land owners of the northern south island Te Tau Ihu. Wakatū has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has. In particular:
  - (a) Wakatū is the third largest owner of marine farms in the Marlborough Sounds.
  - (b) Wakatū also leases or manages a number of additional marine farms in the Marlborough Sounds, including farms owned by Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu.
  - (c) The appeal grounds are broadly framed and relate to matters concerning the coastal environment of the Marlborough Sounds, including assessments of natural character, landscape and ecological areas, and mapping overlays for the same. All of these provisions will potentially impact upon existing marine farms in the Marlborough Sounds owned or operated by Wakatū when new consents are required for those farms.
  - (d) The aquaculture chapter of the Plan has not yet been notified. However, if the relief sought is granted, the appeal has the potential to directly

impact upon the provisions of the aquaculture chapter (in terms of zonings and rules), and also upon the future operation and consenting of marine farms owned, managed or leased by Wakatū in the Marlborough Sounds.

## **Trade competition**

Wakatū is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the Act).

## The Proceedings

Wakatū is interested in all of the proceedings as they relate to the coastal marine area and in particular to the Marlborough Sounds.

#### Particular Issues

- Wakatū is interested in the following particular issues:
  - (a) Any part of the appeal which relates to Chapter 6: Natural Character, in the context of the assessment of natural character in the coastal marine area, and also associated schedules and mapping relating to areas of natural character;
  - (b) Any part of the appeal which relates to Chapter 7: Landscapes, in the context of the assessment of landscapes in the coastal marine area, and also associated schedules and mapping relating to landscapes and landscape features;
  - (c) Any part of the appeal which relates to Chapter 8: Indigenous Biodiversity, and in particular (but not limited to) the parts of the appeal that relate to ecologically significant marine sites, provisions concerning King Shag breeding sites and feeding habitats, and associated schedules and mapping of ecologically significant marine sites;
  - (d) Any parts of the appeal which seek to include provisions providing for biophysical bottom lines for Marlborough's seabed habitats;
  - (e) Any parts of the appeal which relate to Chapter 13: Use of the Coastal Environment and the allocation of Coastal Space;
  - (f) Amendments sought to rule 16.6.6 (king shag feeding habitat);
  - (g) Amendments sought to Appendix 4 (Volume 3) (Criteria for Determining Significant Adverse Effects on Natural Character).

## Relief sought

Wakatū opposes the relief sought because it is inconsistent with the Act and the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement 2010 (NZCPS). It does not promote the sustainable management of the coastal marine area of the Marlborough Sounds, nor does it promote the efficient use and development of natural and physical resources. Further, the relief sought is inconsistent with the requirement to plan strategically in NZCPS policy 7, and with the requirement to provide for aquaculture in appropriate places in terms of NZCPS policies 6 and 8. It does not promote the most appropriate plan provisions in terms of section 32 of the Act.

### Dispute resolution

Wakatū agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceedings.

## **Other Section 274 Party Notices**

Wakatū has also lodged section 274 party notices seeking to join the appeals brought by the Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society ENV-2020-CHC-64 and the Friends of Nelson Haven and Tasman Bay Incorporated ENV-2020-CHC-33 on similar issues.

## Note to person wishing to be a party

You must lodge the original and 1 copy of this notice with the Environment Court within 15 working days after—

- the period for lodging a notice of appeal ends, if the proceedings are an appeal; or
- the decision to hold an inquiry, if the proceedings are an inquiry; or
- the proceedings are commenced, in any other case.

Your right to be a party to the proceedings in the Court may be limited by the trade competition provisions in section 274(1) and Part 11A of the Resource Management Act 1991. The notice must be signed by you or on your behalf.

You must serve a copy of this notice on the relevant local authority and the person who commenced the proceedings within the same 15 working day period and serve copies of this notice on all other parties within 5 working days after that period ends.

However, you may apply to the Environment Court under section 281 of the Resource Management Act 1991 for a waiver of the above timing or service requirements (see form 38).
